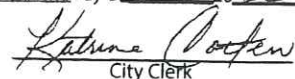

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CITY CHARTER ARTICLE III
ENTITLED “MUNICIPAL OFFICERS” AND
SECTION C5.01 ENTITLED “ACTING OR INTERIM CITY MANAGER”
TO ADD THE POSITION OF DEPUTY CITY MANAGER

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Newburgh as follows:

SECTION 1 - TITLE

This Local Law shall be referred to as “A Local Law Amending City Charter Article III entitled ‘Municipal Officers’ and Section C5.01 entitled ‘Acting or Interim City Manager’ to Add the Position of Deputy City Manager”.

SECTION 2 - AMENDMENT

§C3.00(B) of the City Charter is hereby amended as follows:

§ C3.00 Municipal officers enumerated.

The officers of the City or municipality shall be as follows:

- A. One Mayor, six Councilmen and one City Judge: the Mayor and two Councilmen elected by the qualified voters of the City and four Councilmen elected by the qualified voters of the wards from which they are elected.
- B. One City Manager, one Deputy City Manager, three Civil Service Commissioners, one City Clerk and the members of the Transportation Advisory Committee, appointed by the Council.
- C. One Corporation Counsel, one City Comptroller, one City Assessor, one City Collector, one City Purchasing Agent, one Commissioner of Public Works, one City Engineer, one Superintendent of Public Works, one Superintendent of Water, one Police Chief, one Police Commissioner, one Fire Commissioner, one Fire Chief, one Building Inspector, one Plumbing Inspector, one Registrar of Vital Statistics, one Deputy Registrar of Vital

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Statistics, one Planning and Development Director and one Parks and Recreation Director.

§C3.12(C) of the City Charter is hereby amended as follows:

§ C3.12 Residency requirements.

C. Definitions. As used in this section, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

OFFICER

Includes the City Manager, one Deputy City Manager, three Civil Service Commissioners, the City Clerk, the members of the Transportation Advisory Committee, the Corporation Counsel, the City Comptroller, the City Assessor, the City Collector, the City Purchasing Agent, the Commissioner of Public Works, the City Engineer, the Superintendent of Public Works, the Superintendent of Water, the Police Chief, the Police Commissioner, the Fire Commissioner, the Fire Chief, the Building Inspector, the Plumbing Inspector, the Registrar of Vital Statistics, the Deputy Registrar of Vital Statistics, the Parks and Recreation Director, one Planning and Development Director as enumerated in City Charter Section C3.00B and C initially appointed and hired by the City of Newburgh after the effective date of this local law and the City Marshal and Acting City Marshal initially appointed after the effective date of this local law.

§C5.01 of the City Charter is hereby amended as follows:

§C5.01. Deputy City Manager; Acting or Interim City Manager.

- A. The City Manager may appoint a Deputy City Manager subject to the approval of the Council by majority vote. Once approved, the City Manager may remove the Deputy City Manager with or without cause. The Deputy City Manager shall assist the City Manager in the supervision and control over the administrative departments of the City government and perform such other duties as the City Manager shall direct. The Deputy City Manager shall act as City Manager during the absence or disability of the City Manager.
- B. The City Manager may designate any appointed officer of the City to act as City Manager during the absence or disability of the City Manager and Deputy City Manager; and the person so designated, during the continuance of such absence or disability, shall perform all the duties and have all the powers of the City Manager. In the absence of a designation by the City Manager, the Council may make such designation.
- C. In the event that a vacancy occurs in the office of City Manager due to death, resignation or otherwise, the Council shall immediately commence the process for selecting a new City Manager in accordance with the requirements of § C5.00 of the Charter. Within 10

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days of the occurrence of the vacancy, the City Council shall designate an appointed officer of the City to serve as Interim City Manager. The Interim City Manager shall serve in that position until a new City Manager is appointed; provided, however, the Interim City Manager may not serve more than six months unless the Council, by resolution, certifies the necessity for the continuation of the Interim City Manager and sets forth the reasons why a new City Manager has not been appointed. Upon the adoption of such resolution, the Interim City Manager may continue to serve for no more than an additional six months.

SECTION 3 - SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Local Law are separable and if any provision, clause, sentence, section, subsection, word or part thereof is held to be illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional, or inapplicable to any person or circumstance, such illegality, invalidity, or unconstitutionality, or inapplicability shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, clauses, sentences, subsections, words or parts of this Local Law or their application to other persons or circumstances. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that this Local Law would have been adopted is such illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part had not been included therein, and if such person or circumstance to which the Local Law or part here of is held inapplicable had been specifically exempt therefrom.

SECTION 4 - CODIFICATION

It is the intention of the City Council of the City of Newburgh and it is hereby enacted that the provisions of this Local Law shall be included in the Charter of the City of Newburgh; that the sections and subsections of this Local Law may be re-numbered and/or re-lettered by the codifier to accomplish such intention; that the term "Local Law" shall be changed to "Charter", "Article", or other appropriate word as required for codification; and that any such rearranging of the numbering and/or lettering and editing shall not affect the validity of this Local Law or the provisions of the City Charter affected thereby.

SECTION 5 - VALIDITY

The invalidity of any provision of this Local Law shall not affect the validity of any other provision of this Local Law that can be given effect without such invalid provision.

SECTION 6 - EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law and shall be effective immediately after the filing in the Office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with the provisions of New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO THE AGREEMENT WITH CSX TRANSPORTATION, INC.
FOR CONSTRUCTION ENGINEERING AND INSPECTION SERVICES
RELATED TO THE REPLACEMENT OF THE WALSH ROAD BRIDGE**

WHEREAS, the City of Newburgh has undertaken a Project for the Bridge Replacement of Walsh Road over Quassaick Creek (BIN 2223620) in the City of Newburgh, Orange County, PIN 8761.40 (the “Project”) that is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended, and calls for the apportionment of the costs such program to be borne at the ratio of 80% federal funds and 20% non-federal funds; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 143-2017 of June 12, 2017, the City Council approved a Master Federal Aid Local Project Agreement with the New York State Department of Transportation for preliminary engineering and right-of-way incidental work; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 212-2017 of August 14, 2017, Resolution No. 258-2021 of November 8, 2021 and Resolution No. 82-2022 of April 11, 2022, the City Council approved agreements with WSP USA, Inc. for design, preliminary engineering, right-of-way and construction management services for Project; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 104-2019 of May 13, 2019, the City Council approved a Preliminary Engineering Agreement with CSX Transportation, Inc. for review and assessment of design and plans for the Project; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 107-2022 of May 9, 2022, the City Council approved a construction engineering and inspection services agreement (“Construction Agreement”) with CSX Transportation, Inc. for the Project, and by Resolution No. 247-2024 of November 25, 2024, the City Council approved Construction Contract Amendment No. 1 with CSX Transportation, Inc. to extend the term of the agreement to December 31, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Project is expected to take additional time to complete and CSX Transportation, Inc. has submitted Construction Contract Amendment No. 2 to extend the term of the agreement to December 31, 2027; the same being in the best interests of the City of Newburgh;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Newburgh that the City Manager be and he is hereby authorized to execute Amendment No. 2 to the Construction Agreement with CSX Transportation, Inc. extending the term until December 31, 2027 in the Bridge Replacement of Walsh Road over Quassaick Creek (BIN 2223620) in the City of Newburgh, Orange County, PIN 8761.40.

AMENDMENT NO. 2

B. Capitalized terms used but not defined in this Amendment No. 2 shall have the same meaning as defined in the Agreement.

C. Except as amended by this Amendment No. 2, the Agreement remains in full force and effect in accordance with its terms.

It is the intention of the City Council of the City of Newburgh and it is hereby enacted that the provisions of this Local Law shall be included in the Charter of the City of Newburgh; that the sections and subsections of this Local Law may be re-numbered and/or re-lettered by the codifier to accomplish such intention; that the term “Local Law” shall be changed to “Charter”, “Article”, or other appropriate word as required for codification; and that any such rearranging of the numbering and/or lettering and editing shall not affect the validity of this Local Law or the provisions of the City Charter affected thereby.

SECTION 5 – VALIDITY

The invalidity of any provision of this Local Law shall not affect the validity of any other provision of this Local Law that can be given effect without such invalid provision.

SECTION 6 – EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law and shall be effective immediately after the filing in the Office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with the provisions of New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.
